You will work closely with Specialist Mental Health Services, Odyssey House and Purapura Whetu, as well as other partners in the Manu Ka Rere service.

We would like you to have the ability to create an environment that will assist tangata what or develop their full potential. Excellent rapport building and good time management skills.

It is essential that you hold a **registerable Allied Health qualification**, e.g., Social Work, Nursing, Occupational Therapist or Counselling.
